### Directions for Use

Garlon 4 Ultra controls only broadleaf plants that are emerged at the time of application. See the main label for a list of susceptible weeds.

#### PRECAUTIONS

Post emergence applications on newly emerged or established sorghum sudangrass, teff, crabgrass, and pearl millet are not recommended. Unacceptable injury or death of these grasses may occur with Garlon 4 Ultra applications.

#### Pre-plant applications for control of susceptible emerged weeds

Apply Garlon 4 Ultra at a maximum of 1.5 pts/acre with a non-ionic surfactant to control susceptible weeds prior to planting tall fescue, orchardgrass, timothy, and annual ryegrass, sorghum sudangrass, teff, crabgrass, and pearl millet. Applications can be made the same day of planting.

#### Post planting applications for control of susceptible emerged weeds

Apply Garlon 4 Ultra at a maximum of 1.5 pts/acre with a non-ionic surfactant to tall fescue, orchardgrass, timothy, and annual ryegrass after seedling plants have at least reached the V3 stage (three collared leaves).

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
