SECTION 4: First-aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

First-aid measures after inhalation

: IF INHALED: Remove person to fresh air and keep comfortable for breathing. Call a POISON CENTER or doctor/physician if you feel unwell.

4.2. Most important symptoms and effects (acute and delayed)

ELIMINATE all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks or flames in immediate area). Evacuate unnecessary personnel. Turn off electric power to area. Stay upwind. Stop leak if safe to do so. Ventilate area. Wear appropriate personal protective equipment, avoid direct contact.
